2022-2023 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

In the 2022-2023 academic year, AMIS served 520 international students overall. Of these:

- 480 attended at least 1 AMIS event
- 190 participated in 2 or more ways with AMIS (Amigo program or event)
- 100 participated in 3 or more ways with AMIS
- 140 participated in the Amigo Friendship program

AMIS VOLUNTEERS




