The world has been profoundly changed by the events of 2020, and AMIS has risen to meet the challenges.

When the pandemic closed everything in March, international students, alone and far from home, faced the sudden move to remote instruction, isolation due to social distancing and travel restrictions, and uncertainties about changes to student visas. All of this has filled international students with anxiety throughout the year.

AMIS has remained steadfast in our mission to promote cultural and global understanding through friendship and hospitality with international students and scholars in the greater Atlanta area. Since the spring, we have been **re-imagining international friendship** by creating new ways to welcome and connect with students during the COVID pandemic. We initiated various virtual groups through Zoom, sent jigsaw puzzles in the spring, and mailed welcome packages with cloth masks and handwritten notes at the beginning of the fall semester.

This fall, we have continued to offer our Amigo Friendship Program, which has always been at the heart of AMIS, while encouraging virtual connections in the beginning.

In AMIS, we continue to believe in the power of friendships across cultures to make the world a better place and to positively impact international students, the future leaders of the world. We also believe in the ability of these friendships to expand our cross-cultural experiences, making those who volunteer with AMIS better because of it.



## **DURING A PANDEMIC**

In the spring, Susan Rembert (our Program Administrator) and I invited students to chat with us through weekly Zoom groups. Then we surveyed students and came up with topics for virtual groups for the month of June and drew in volunteers to facilitate the groups. This fall, we created a Zoom series of the most popular topics on Culture, Careers, America 101, and American TV, all led by AMIS volunteers.

In America 101, international students learned about the differences between credit and debit cards. In Careers, advice on finding a job and networking was shared. Practical and educational learning was gained as well as opportunities to engage with others. One volunteer in America 101 said, "We never stopped talking about food!"

Our Amigo volunteers have been finding ways to safely offer friendship and hospitality during a pandemic, one hosting dinners on her porch, and others taking walks or meeting for socially distanced picnics.
